Get your hands dirty...



Sensory play: Provide your child with a container than can hold dirt and water. Fill your container with soil. This can be potting soil or soil from your yard. Search your home for items to explore the dirt with. Suggestions: small plastic animals/insects, shovels, scooping containers, a watering can, flowers (fake or real)

or any small gardening tools. Spend time with your child scooping, molding and exploring the materials.

Get your hands dirty...

Planting: If possible, use a clear container to add soil/dirt. Have seeds available to plant. (Bean seeds grown quickly so you can see first hand the parts of the plant and how a seed grows). The clear containers allow you to pick up and view the roots and how they work. Once the plants get large enough you can transfer them to a garden or pot.



Let's imagine...

Fairy Gardens are fun for the whole family! Allow your imagination to soar. Use materials from home or various craft stores which now carry fairy garden materials. There is no wrong way to create a fairy garden. Your imagination is unlimited! No outdoor area? No worries! You can use materials to create one within your home.





Did you know...The wonder of seeing a garden grow may spark your kids to ask questions like: Why do the plants need sun? How do plants grow? How

do the plants grow differently?
